Lent is the forty days before Easter (excluding Sundays) when we get ready to celebrate Easter, when Jesus died on the cross and rose again so that we can live with God forever in Heaven. During Lent we try and prepare ourselves for the joy of Easter by spending time in prayer and reflection. We may try and eat less on certain days, give more money to the poor, make a special effort to spend time with people who need our help, or prepare in other ways. There are lots of events in the church during Lent to help and guide us through this special time, and we would love to share them with you.

It doesn't matter if you haven't been to church for a long, or perhaps you're not sure what you believe. You're still very welcome to join us for any of these events.

#### Free Pancakes for All!

Pancake Day is traditionally known as Shrove Tuesday, the day when people used up their 'luxury' food items of milk, eggs and sugar before Lent began. Although not everyone gives up these items for Lent, it's still a great excuse to eat pancakes! Come and join us in a last-minute feast before Lent starts, and it's all totally FREE!!!

St Teresa's Hall is in the corner of Vicarage and Connaught Road – opposite Sidmouth Garage.

## Ash Wednesday

Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> March 10am and 7pm in the Church

The first day of Lent. During this service you can receive a cross made from ashes on your forehead (if you want to!) which helps to remind us that we have made wrong choices and want to try to do better in the future.

Fridays in Lent 6pm in the church

Short services which give you the chance to reflect on the journey to his passion, death and resurrection. Each week a different group of parishioners lead the service with their own interpretation on the story so there should be something to appeal to every taste.
