#### What is Advent?

Advent is the season of the year when we prepare for Christ's coming at Christmas. The word Advent derives from the Latin for 'coming'. During Advent we look back with joy to the first coming of Christ as a baby in Bethlehem and we also look to the future with hope to when Christ will come again. This sense of preparation and expectation is emphasised by our undecorated Christmas tree.

#### Why is everything purple during Advent?

Purple is the colour of penitence, which is central to our Advent preparation – we prepare our hearts to welcome Christ at Christmas by repenting of our sins and reconciling ourselves to God. Our Reconciliation services are a perfect opportunity to do this, and this year you have twice as many opportunities to attend!

### Why do we have a wreath?

The wreath symbolises many things:

It is round to remind us that God's love for us is eternal, like a circle it has no beginning or end. Our lives, here and now, participate in the eternity of God's plan of salvation and so we too hope to share in that eternal life in heaven. It is green to remind us that God's love is evergreen; it never changes. The candles remind us of the Light coming into the world to scatter the darkness and show us the way of righteousness.

The four candles are for the four weeks of Advent; one is lit each week. Three

candles are purple, representing our sorrow for our sins, our penance and preparation, and the pink candle (lit on the third Sunday of Advent) represents our joy at the coming of Christ.

As we move through Advent, the progression of the lighted candles shows our increasing readiness to meet the Lord.

#### Advent prayer for children

Lord Jesus, I want to prepare myself to receive you in joy and peace. Light up the path that leads me to Christmas. Amen.
